#### Questions:

**1. PRIORITIES: What are your top three state legislative priorities and how would you address them?**

**A:** My priorities are to continue fighting for hardworking families and restoring lost revenue sharing to our local municipalities. Workers in this state have been under assault since 2010. It's time to put people first again in Michigan and reverse Snyder's attacks on working families by eliminating the unfair senior pension tax and repealing right-to-work "for less." Drastic cuts to revenue sharing have severely affected local police and fire services; thus, making Michigan less safe.

**2. EDUCATION: What measures do you support/propose to achieve improved educational outcomes and accessibility for Michigan students from early childhood through post-secondary education?**

**A:** Strong public schools are the bedrock to every strong and successful community. We must stop the expansion of "for profit" charter and cyber schools and adequately fund our public schools. We must invest in our children's futures as well by investing further in our public post-secondary education system including both the two year and four year colleges and universities and trade schools. This commitment will reduce the cost of college and strengthen Michigan's education system as a whole.

**3. ECONOMY: What policies do you support to increase jobs and help Michigan residents improve their economic positions?**

**A:** The state is only as strong as its economy and middle class. I will continue to fight to keep jobs from leaving Michigan and will work to support and grow small business. I will work to improve our state's infrastructure; strong infrastructure echoes throughout our economy and has been shown to be dollar for dollar the best way to help grow the economy. It will also help to ensure that a crisis like the one in Flint never happen again. I also am in favor of mandating paid parental leave.

**4. ELECTIONS: What state policies do you support regarding campaign funding and voting rights?**

**A:** Strong voting rights are essential for a strong state and nation. I am against many of the recent changes to our election laws rammed through the State Legislature in Lansing. We need to implement no-reason absentee voting and automatic registration when getting your driver's license. Michigan must reform its campaign finance system to ensure special interests do not rule the roost and prevent corruption.

**A:** My biggest environmental priorities are investing in renewable energy and protecting our water. We must transition away from fossil fuels and towards the clean energies of tomorrow. To get there, we need to ban fracking, provide more subsidies to renewable energy, and give more funding and grants for research and development of sustainable technology and energy. We must fight to protect our Great Lakes; ensuring that Enbridge Line 5 is properly maintained and not a threat to our natural resources, continuing to fight against the introduction of Asian Carp in our lakes, and expand the bottle return law.

**A:** I will pursue and support any policy that improves social and racial justice. In my lifetime I have seen many instances of social and racial injustice through my family and my career.
