President's Message Christina Schlitt

A special thank you to all of the donors that have generously supported the LWVMI and the LWVMIEF this past 2020-2021 fiscal year. Without your continuous and solid support, the LWVMI Board of Directors and the over 2600 League members in Michigan would not have had the opportunity to successfully carry out the mission of the League: to empower voters and defend democracy.

As you will see throughout the annual reports, there has been growth in every aspect of the League arena. Facing the life interruption of COVID-19, we have mastered new skills in the digital/virtual world so that we could continue to serve the public. Just like our suffragist foremothers, we have successfully learned a new way of doing business, but we aren't done! 100 years of history is an incredible incentive to persevere and then look forward to the next 100 years!

Our mission has been strengthened this year as a result of comprehensive educational initiatives accomplished by our members, our work partners and the Michigan public concerning the changes in voting rights, the Independent Citizens' Redistricting Commission and the 2020 Census. In everything we did, we looked at the actions through the DEI lens-Diversity, Equity and Inclusion.

The election of 2020 proved to be the challenge that was anticipated. LWVMI members met that challenge with the usual integrity through voter registration; candidate forums; VOTE411 (digitally and printed), the fundamental source of information for voters; working with local clerks to meet the overwhelming response of absentee voting -- all through pandemic restrictions.

In large numbers, members became poll workers to help with the fair and secure voting process. They took an oath to uphold the integrity of the election process to ensure each voter's ballot was counted. Members observed the county board canvassing process and combatted mis and dis-truths in relation to all voting rights and election integrity.

We are transforming the League from the experience we have gained. Our confidence in the future is positive, innovative and based on the accomplishments we have achieved.

The Michigan Independent Citizens Redistricting Commission was seated in the fall of 2020 after the process of random selection. While the commissioners were learning what their task at hand encompassed, League members were recruited to be observers of the process. This is historical in that Michigan now has the first independent commission to develop fair maps. We continued the education process as League members held town halls to talk about redistricting, the commission and Communities of Interest (COI). Another phase of the process on the road to fair maps is that COIs were trained by League members to submit testimony and even their own maps for the MICRC to consider their interests in developing fair maps. Our members are working with the MICRC and staff to conduct public hearings required by the constitutional amendment.

To honor our legacy, we look forward to playing a critical role in a more perfect representative government by employing our dual role of education and advocacy. Wearing the advocacy hat will be in the forefront as we meet the systematic affronts to voter rights that are being leveled from legislative bills and other maneuvers, even as they are touted as reforms. The League's nonpartisan position will be viewed and called out by some as we protect voter rights. We have been protecting the rights of voters for over 100 years. We are clear where we stand: to empower voters and defend democracy.

As Michigan and our country evolve in ways that we could not fathom, we invite you to continue to grow with us as we share our message with one voice – you are not muted! Join us as we strive to engage all of our communities to participate in government so that the League values of non-partisanship, transparency, dignity, diversity, inclusion, equity and civility will strengthen our democracy.

We welcome you to join us in building future successes.

Voter Services Betsy Cushman, VP Voter Services

“Empowering Voters” and “Defending Democracy” entirely and accurately describe our activities in the past year. When we empower voters, we defend democracy.

- **VOTE411:** The LWVMI VOTE411 team managed State & Congressional races online and provided guidance and support to Local Leagues. New in 2020 was a fun campaign to promote VOTE411 in various markets in Michigan, including NPR, PBS, MLive and Facebook, with great impact.
- **Printed State Voter Guides:** Despite the pandemic, we printed and distributed 110,000 State Voter Guides, an increase of 5,000 over the 2018 level. We added Michigan’s New Voting Rights information to create a 40-page Voter Guide. Copies were distributed throughout the State by Local Leagues, District and Local Branch Libraries, to many organizations including the ACLU, Michigan Nonprofit Association, Michigan Faith in Action, Michigan Coalition Against Homelessness, PRIDE Detroit and the Detroit Parent Network; copies were also distributed to food banks, shelters, and tribal councils.
- **Making Democracy Work:** The State LWV provided Local Leagues with the tools, such as scripts, flyers, and Powerpoints, to hold Town Halls to explain Michigan’s new Voting Rights. Local Leagues worked with other community nonpartisan organizations to reach traditional and new partners to help enable all potential voters to have voting access.
- **Coalitions:** We value our relationships with various coalitions, especially the Voter Engagement and Election Protection Coalitions, as well as our partnership with the Secretary of State’s office. The excellent memes for social media provided crucial voter information at the exact right moment. Some of our LWVMI Facebook posts reached thousands.
- **Poll Workers & Clerk Engagement:** Through our partnership with the Secretary of State and MichiganVoting.org Coalition, we were better able to recruit Poll Workers, expand our Local Clerk Engagement, and reach voters and groups who are often overlooked or unaware of the LWV / VOTE411 / State Voter Guides.
- **Support for Local League Voter Service Teams:** Monthly and weekly Zoom meetings offered updates, support and sharing opportunities.
- **Preparation for 2021 Local Elections:** We developed a series of zoom meetings called 4 *Tuesdays in February*, and guests from the Secretary of State’s office gave information and updates. Topics included: Voter Services for the Times We Live In, Sexy Local Elections, The Election Process & Mis/Disinformation, and Are Voter Registration Campaigns Still Needed? Turnout was great as League members welcomed these updates.



Advocacy Susan Smith, VP Advocacy

This past year, LWVMI had two major advocacy goals:

- Monitoring the implementation of Proposal Two, which created the Michigan Independent Citizens Redistricting Commission.
- Monitoring the implementation of Proposal Three which added 7 new voting rights to the Michigan Constitution.

Monitoring the Michigan Independent Citizens Redistricting Commission (MICRC)

A team of trained League volunteers:

- Observed and reported on MICRC meetings and Public Hearings.
- Participated in training on how to: identify Communities of Interest (COI), write and give testimony, draw maps using mapping software, and use the MICRC Public Comment Portal.
- Recruited and trained local League teams in writing and giving testimony, using mapping software to draw COI maps and submitting maps and testimony in the MICRC Portal.
- Supported local League teams in identifying and training COIs in their communities.

LWVMI Filed an Amicus Brief in support of the Michigan Independent Citizens Redistricting Commission's request to the Michigan Supreme Court for a waiver of the Constitution's November 1, 2021 map approval deadline.

Monitoring Implementation of Proposal Three and Michigan's New Voting Rights

The LWVMI Advocacy Committee met monthly to review selected bills which had been introduced into the state Legislature. The Committee recommended to the LWVMI Board that it oppose bills that:

- Added new Voter ID requirements.
- Created barriers to absentee voting.
- Increased barriers to citizens' right to place a ballot proposal on the Michigan ballot.
- Made election administration partisan and cumbersome.

LWVMI Educated League members on Voter Suppression Bills in Michigan by:

- Hosting an advocacy workshop on voter suppression bills and how to advocate against them.
- Hosting a webinar on anti-voter bills with perspectives by a voting rights specialist and the LWVUS CEO. Members of the League and partner organizations were invited to attend.

LWVMI Protected Michigan Voters by filing a lawsuit as lead Plaintiff that:

- Challenged constitutionality of PA 608 which created new obstacles to citizens' constitutional right to place ballot proposals on the Michigan ballot by making ballot proposal signature collection more difficult.

LWV Greater Grand Rapids Area completed the process to become a State Unit (MAL) in April 2021.

Using the Zoom Meeting platform, we offered an opportunity for the Geographical Units and Member-At-Large League leaders to meet and share challenges and successes.

Seven Michigan Coaches, who are experienced League members, continue to offer consultation to Local Leagues, State Units/Member-at-Large Units and Geographical Units on best practices regarding leadership, membership, Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) and development.

New Positions Increase Advocacy Reach

For almost two years, League members around the state have been studying Lame Duck Legislative Sessions in Michigan, thanks to a directive from LWVMI Convention delegates in 2019. Careful study of an issue at the grassroots level is a hallmark of enduring League positions. Our new position acknowledges that although lame duck sessions may be constitutional, the League supports reforms to increase transparency and public participation.

LWVMI also has a new position on Criminal Justice, adopted by the 2021 Convention delegates by concurrence. This position was studied and created by the California LWV, and Michigan members agreed that it fit our support of a system that is just, effective, equitable, transparent, and that fosters public trust at all stages, including policing practices, pre-trial procedures, sentencing, incarceration, and re-entry.

State Convention Held Virtually



Like so many other projects the League has faced during the pandemic, we adapted our weekend-long biennial convention to an online platform. Though we missed the networking opportunities that an in-person event provided, this year's May 2021 convention allowed many more members from around Michigan to attend. We hosted more than 260 delegates and members who elected officers, passed a budget, adopted positions, and enacted bylaw changes.

Besides the plenary sessions and workshops, participants heard from notable speakers including Secretary of State Jocelyn Benson, and Michigan Lt. Governor, Garlin Gilchrist. We look forward to a 2023 in-person convention in Lansing.

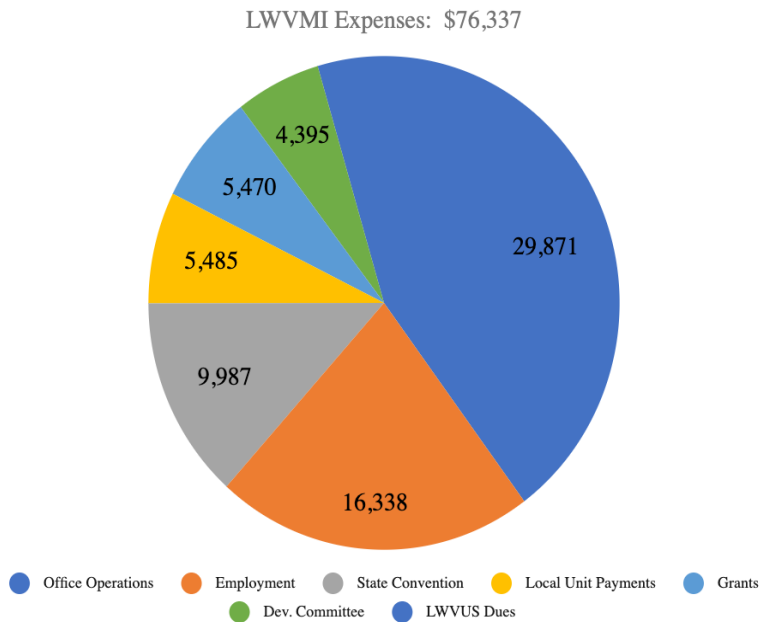
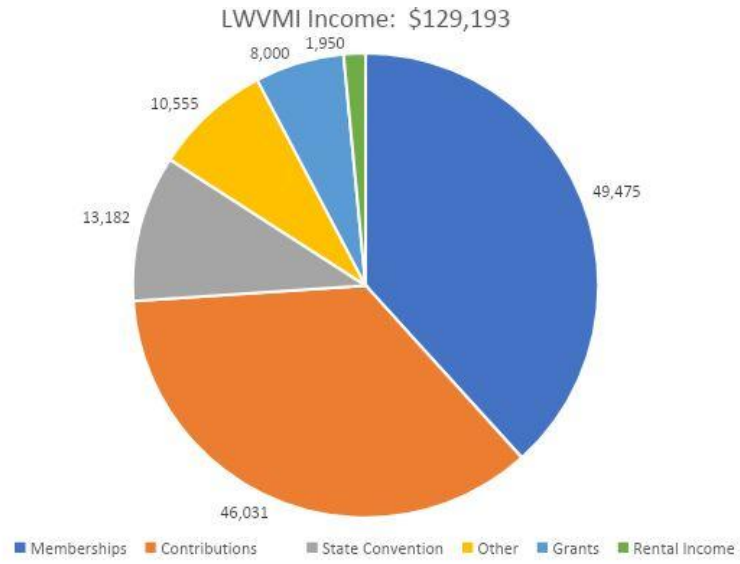

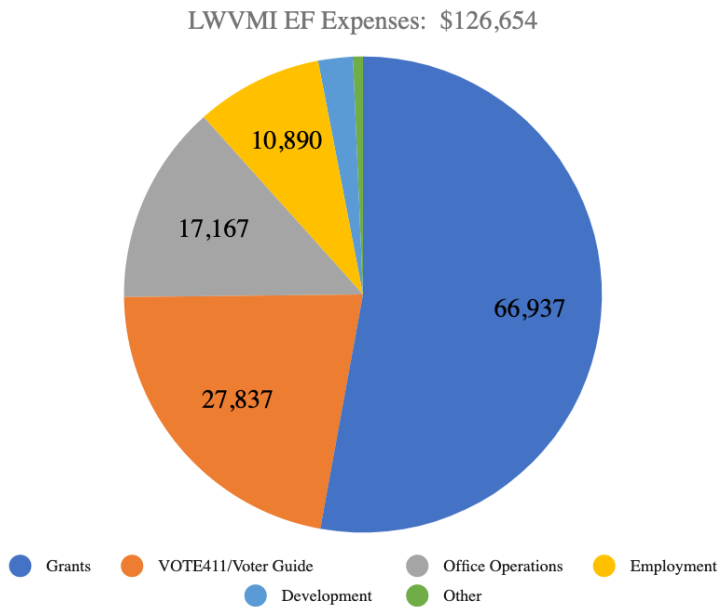
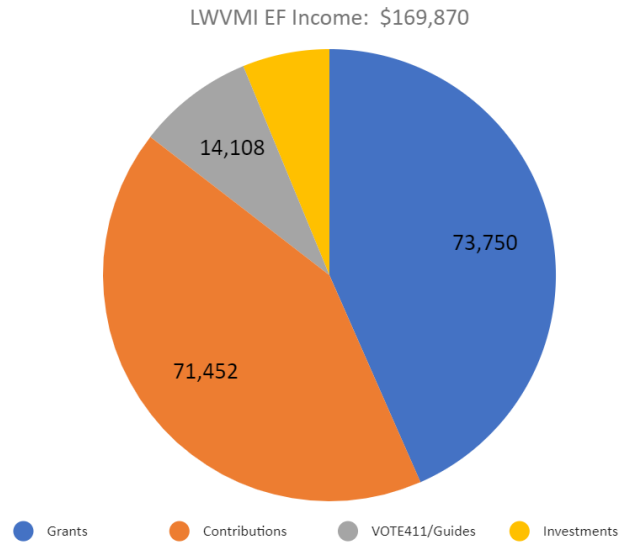
Finances

LWVMI (501c4) The LWVMI office operates and is staffed thanks to the dues paid by local Leagues (State Per Member Payment--PMP) and donors' generous gifts. Office operations and staffing were 61% of expenses; PMP and gifts constituted 74% of income. Please contact LWVMI for further information.



LWVMI Education Fund (501c3) The Education Fund serves as the vehicle for the League's voter education and protection efforts; 75% of expenses supported Democracy Agenda grant activities and Voter Guides/VOTE411. The Education Fund supported State League office operations and staffing with 22% of its expenses. Grants made up 43% and gifts from donors provided another 42% of income.
