Advocating at the Local League Level June 22, 2021

I. Effective Advocacy:

Giving the right message to the right person at the right time

- 1. Right Message
 - Includes researched talking points
 Example, "Making voting more convenient"
 not
 "Making voting easier"
 - Is consistent
 The League speaks with one voice at each level of League.
 Only the League president or designee speaks for the League
- 2. Right Person is appropriate to League and government level
 - Local Leagues may talk to local officials about local issues
 - Local Leagues may **not** talk to state officials unless they have permission from LWVMI or receive an Action Alert
 - Local Leagues may **not** talk to federal officials unless they have permission from LWVMI and LWVUS or receive an Action Alert
- 3. Right time is determined by appropriate League Board.
- II. Two Ways to Advocate at the Local League Level
 - 1. Responding to Action Alerts sent by LWVMI or LWVUS
 - Action alert ask individual members to contact their state or federal official as a League member.
 - No additional permission needed

- Letter or message usually suggested
- 2. Action initiated at the local League level
 - Local League Board chooses to advocate on an issue before a local unit of government such as city council, planning commission, school board, township or county board of supervisors
 - Advocacy must be supported by an appropriate local, state or national League position (See lwvmi.org or LWVUS "Impact on Issues", available from Amazon.com)
 - No permission is needed from state or national League
 - Local League Board authorizes President (or her/his designee) to speak on a local issue to local officials

Example: Testifying at City Council re proposed development in the city

III. Local Advocacy Committees

- 1. Local League Board may establish local Advocacy Committee
- 2. Advocacy Committee:
 - Gathers information on local issues using Observer Corp reports on local government meetings
 - Considers interests of their local League members
 - Reviews appropriate local, state and national positions
 - Recommends action to local League Board: for example, writing a letter, giving testimony at public meeting
 - Prepares letter or written testimony for President to approve
