**Voter Registration - anytime**

**Voting before Election Day  
by Absentee Ballot for ALL  
registered voters**

**Weekend Hours - just before  
the Election**

**Automatic Voter Registration  
for those with MI ID/Drivers License**

## NEW! Register to vote anytime

Through 15 days before the Election, you can register in many ways – your choice: at [www.Michigan.gov/VoterRegistration](http://www.Michigan.gov/VoterRegistration) by online registration, by mail, in person at your city/ township/county clerk’s office or at a Secretary of State office, or at a registration drive.

During the last 14 days before the Election and on Election Day, you must register in person at your clerk’s office with proof of residency.

Proof of residency Driver’s license or personal ID card or any of the following: utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, government check, government document. This must be current and have your name and address on it (Electronic copy ok)

The weekend before the Election, clerk offices are open an extra 8 hours – to register and to vote. Go to your clerk’s website for specific hours. You can find your local clerk at [www.mi.gov/vote](http://www.mi.gov/vote)



## Apply for an Absentee Ballot

- Download an application at [www.Michigan.gov/sos](http://www.Michigan.gov/sos) or
- Visit your city/township clerk’s office

**NEW!** No reason Absentee Voting –You don’t need an excuse. All registered voters can vote before Election Day by Absentee Ballot.

**NEW!** All clerk offices will be open at least 8 hours during the weekend before the election.

**NEW!** Registered voters can apply, receive a ballot and vote – all at the same time – if you visit your clerk’s office within 45 days prior to election (when ballots are available). Last day to do this is 4 pm the day before election.

**Sign and return it in time!** Absentee ballots will not be counted if the outside envelope is not signed by the voter and **received** in the clerk’s office by 8 pm Election Day. (Signature must match.)
