23 “pro voter”
bills passed
between July 1
and
November 7,
2023

- Legislation was passed to codify the passage of Proposal 2 in 2022 (“Promote the Vote”)
- Bills are “pro-voter” providing better voter access and convenience
- Improves election security
- Protects election workers from intimidation and harassment
- Be the ‘expert’ when friends and family discuss these new rights.

Hop in!

People can now legally take other voters to the polls in Michigan.

- 1891 law made it a misdemeanor to provide transportation to the polls.
- Ban was repealed in 2023 via HB 4568.
- Partner with a political party or church group.
- Or offer to take a neighbor.

Be able to defend security

- Michigan has passed laws that make our elections some of the most secure in the country.
- Polling sites are NOT connected to the internet.
- Michigan has both a computerized counting system and a paper ballot system that must match.
- Voters must sign an “application” at the polls or when requesting absentee ballot. Felony charges can be brought to those who falsify.
- Every county has a bi-partisan canvassing board which has a clear duty to certify elections based on the official records of votes cast.

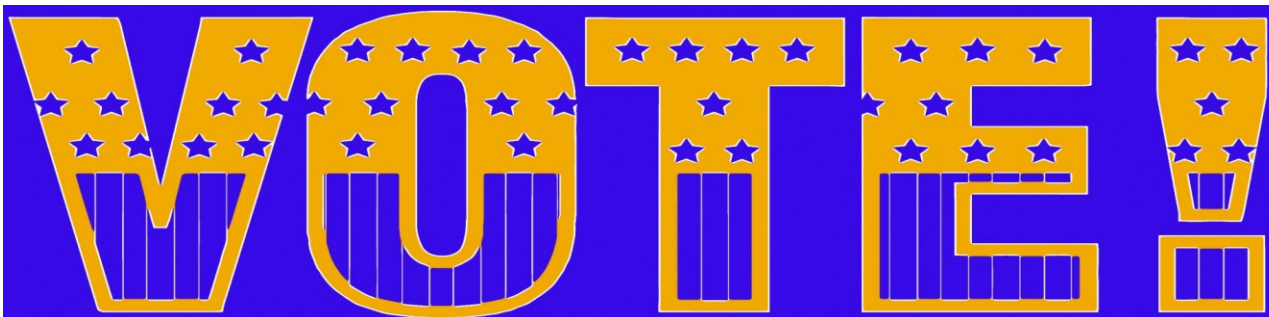




Vote
